Decision Point Small Groups: All adults in our parish are encouraged to sign up to participate in one of our Decision Point small groups. Groups will meet for six week and begin meeting the week of February 15. These one hour sessions are a great way to strengthen your faith during Lent.

Prayers For Life: On January 22 our nation will mark the 42nd anniversary of Roe v. Wade, the Supreme Court decision that made abortion legal throughout the U.S. Since that tragic decision, more than 56 million children's lives have been lost to abortion, and many suffer that loss -- often in silence. Join thousands of Catholics across the country coming together in prayer for a "culture of life" from Saturday, January 17 - Sunday, January 25!

Welcome to DECISION POINT: DECISION POINT is a Confirmation preparation program designed primarily for Catholics between the ages of twelve and eighteen. It has been designed to help Catholics discover the richness of the Catholic Faith. In the process of testing the program many people said, "Every Catholic should experience this program - not just teens preparing for confirmation!"

Here at St. Joseph and St. John parishes you will have the opportunity to do just that this coming Lent. You are invited to participate by signing up for a small group. These groups will meet for six weeks beginning February 15. Each session will last about one hour and begin with a short prayer, followed by a 15-20 minute video presentation, some discussion and then a closing prayer. Groups will meet in people homes or in the parish hall.

Engage with other parishioners in a life-changing conversation about the genius of Catholicism. For too long we have watched people walk away from the faith. The tragedy is, most of them have never had the genius of Catholicism presented to them in a compelling way. So they have walked away, completely unaware of what they were turning their backs on. Something has to change.

Pope Francis has asked all us to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ. We all need to hear the Gospel message anew and apply it to our very day lives. Whenever we encounter Christ our lives are changed forever. DECISION POINT will help you have a deeper relationship with God and the Church.

The reason for these gatherings in to pray together for greater visible unity among all Christians. Seeing God in the Poor: Last Sunday Pope Francis spoke to 40,000 people telling them that with the baptism of Jesus the time of “closed skies”, i.e. the separation between God and man, was over. “The earth has become God’s dwelling among men and women, and each of us has the opportunity to **meet the Son of God**, experiencing all his love and infinite mercy.” We can meet him in the sacraments, “we can recognize him **in the faces** of our brothers and sisters, especially **the poor, the sick, the imprisoned**, the refugees. They are the living flesh of the suffering Christ and the visible image of the invisible God.” Volunteer to work with St. Vincent de Paul and you will have the opportunity to meet the Son of God.

Joy of the Gospel (1) Those who have a true encounter with Christ find their lives filled with happiness. This is a deep happiness that brings inner emptiness to an end because these Christians are set free from selfishness. They are saved. I want to encourage everyone who experiences this to spread the word, beginning a new chapter in the history of the Church. – Pope Francis.

REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS:

1 Samuel 3:3b-10, 19: Samuel was a young boy who grew up in the Temple. His teacher was Eli. God loved Samuel very much. In this story, God calls to Samuel in his sleep. Because Samuel is not used to hearing God’s voice, he runs to Eli, thinking his teacher has called him. When this happens a third time, Eli tells Samuel to answer God by saying, “Speak, for your servant is listening.” For the rest of his life Samuel listened to God. He became a great prophet among his people. God speaks to us in many ways, especially in the sacraments and through God’s word in the Bible. Sometimes God speaks to us in the beauty of nature. Often he speaks to us in the events of our lives. Most of all, God comes to us in the love and in the needs of other people.

1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20: The Greek city of Corinth was a bustling seaport that was notorious in ancient times for immorality. The new Christian community there found itself surrounded on all sides by examples of all kinds of sin of body and mind. Paul reminds his readers that our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who dwells in us. There are temptations in our world, just as there were in Corinth. But when we respect our bodies and use them as God teaches us, we are fully alive and free from vices that can make us slaves. Drugs, drunkenness, sexual sins—these have no place in the lives of children of God.

John 1:35-42: The reading tells us about the call of the first disciples. Followers of John the Baptist responded to the gentle invitation of Jesus; they came and stayed the whole day with him. Then these disciples called their friends to join them. One of them was Simon. Jesus told him that he would be called Peter, or Cephas, a Greek word for “rock.” One day the Church would be built on the rocklike faith of Peter.
