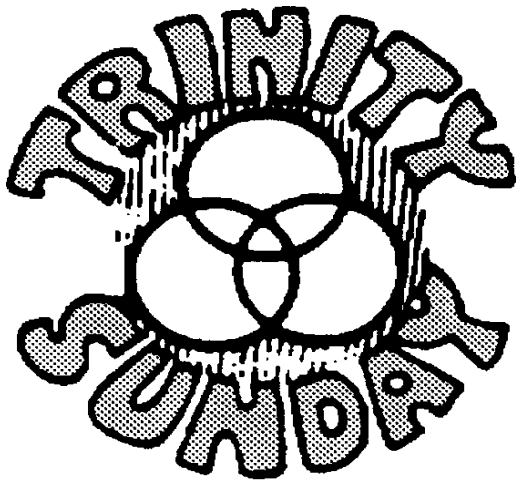

In other words, we are called to sacrifice ourselves to help others.

During the times and in the places Christianity was illegal, making the Sign of the Cross became a secret way for Christians to recognize one another. Today, Catholics often make the Sign of the Cross when we enter a church. We dip our fingers into holy water to make the Sign of the Cross, as a reminder of our Baptism.
